National Borders Locked Down Amid Coronavirus

On Friday, March 20, 2020, Secretary of State Mike Pompeo announced that the U.S. borders with Canada and Mexico would be closed to nonessential travelers starting Saturday at midnight.

The State Department already issued a Level 4: Do Not Travel advisory, which advises Americans not to travel abroad.

Americans “should arrange immediate return” to the United States or risk being stuck for an extended period outside the country, according to Pompeo.

It’s unclear if further travel restrictions will be implemented by the administration, but closures to the North American borders and bans from European travelers suggest more restrictions will come.
